EQUESTRIAN DOCUMENTARY, "A MIND LIKE STILL WATER," PREMIERS AT AMERICAN DOCUMENTARY AND ANIMATION FILM FESTIVAL

FAIRFIELD, Iowa, – March 16, 2020 – "A Mind Like Still Water" is a documentary film that follows two horse owners during an equestrian clinic led by The Masterson Method founder Jim Masterson and horse trainer Mark Rashid. The film will premiere at the annual American Documentary and Animation (AmDocs) Film Festival March 27, 2020 in Palm Springs, California.

Once a year, world-renowned duo, Rashid and Masterson, come together to hold a clinic in Littleton, Colorado. The documentary features participants Mindy and Linda as they learn to let go of past issues and better connect with their horses.

"Learning with your horse is remarkable experience for many participants," Masterson said. "Not only do they build a new trust-focused relationship with their horse, but they learn about themselves and how to connect on a deeper level. It has been wonderful to team up with Mark Rashid in documenting the transformation of horse and rider."

ABOUT THE MASTERSON METHOD

The Masterson Method was developed by Jim Masterson after many years as a professional equine bodyworker. It is an interactive approach to equine massage in which the horse is an active participant. The practitioner learns to recognize and use the responses of the horse to their touch. Through the horse's response, the practitioner is able to locate and relieve tension in key junctions of the horse's body that most affect performance. It is something done *with* the horse, rather than to the horse.
